Superintendent Blake Cooper said enrollment was down 14 students from September with a count of 1593, continuing a trend from last year.

Mr. Cooper shared concussion protocol and parent information with the board.

He reported that the bond refinance was completed, knocking off three years from the payment schedule and saving over \$700,000.

Julia Robinson, director of curriculum, reported that the district would seek a bilingual waiver this year for kindergarten classrooms.

The District joined with Texas A&M University-Commerce to host a reception in honor of Senator Bob Deuell and Representative Dan Flynn.
