Absence closing threshold set

The CISD Board of Trustees approved setting the threshold for curtailing school activities at 3 percent for three consecutive days for absences due to student COVID illness.

Working with Director of Health Services Kathy Myers, Superintendent Charlie Alderman recommended a 3 percent standard for prohibiting group activities within the school. For a school closure, 6 percent of students would need to be absent due to COVID positive testing. If two campuses were above the 6 percent mark, the District would close.

"We have increased the minutes for every school day so we would be able to close for up to five days without having to make up days," Alderman said. He stated that district has only had one day above the 3 percent cutoff thus far.

The availability of substitute teachers will determine if schools are closed because of a lack of staff.

Dr. LaVelle Hendricks abstained from voting on the measure.
