\$300K grant awarded to ag program

The Board voted unanimously to approve the purchase of a virtual reality welding training simulator. A \$300,000 grant was awarded to the CHS Ag Department to purchase the simulator and other welding equipment.

According to Dr. Andrea Ellis, director of NETCAT Career and Technology Consortium, the equipment will help anxious students tackle projects before being subjected to the real equipment. The equipment will be placed in use immediately and is completely portable so that it can be moved to the new ag building when it is completed.

Band continues to set records for performances

The Roaring Tiger Band was honored for reaching higher levels of performance this fall. The Board recognized their efforts during Monday's regular board meeting.

In October, the marching band participated in the Area B Marching Contest and placed first in preliminaries and second in finals making this the best Area results in CHS history.

CMS band students auditioned for the All Region Band against 18 other middle schools. Director Jason Wallace said 18 students won seats.

In December, CHS band had 47 students audition for All Region Band among 20 other bands, seven of which were 4A and two that were private. A total of 25 students earned seats in the band. Twenty-five members advanced to Area. Proudly, Director Kara Wallace explained that CHS had more students advancing to Area in our region.
