students and staff navigate through new guidelines



As the more rigorous daily requirements of in-home instruction kicked off this week, hybrid model in-person instruction began at each campus as well.

Approximately 21 percent of CISD students chose to remain at home to have instruction delivered online. Requirements were stepped up by TEA to include completion of daily assignments for at-home learners. Chromebooks or iPads were distributed to every student who requested one.

For the in-person model, approximately half of the students attend two days and they will have online work the other three days.

CES Principal Wanda Beane said a large portion of this week went to instruction on health and safety procedures such as washing hands properly and social distancing.

A survey will be distributed Friday for parents, staff and the community to share their opinions on how to proceed after the two-week hybrid model. At Monday night's regular Board meeting, members will discuss options and consider feedback.
